TRANSPORT

As a reminder with regard to the transport solution and services required prior to the official start (i.e. 06h00 on 16 September for airport transfers and 06h00 on 19 September for shuttles during the tournament), we advise as follows:

Should you require an airport transfer or a shuttle prior to the above dates and times, please put your request in writing to Yolisha at wc2020@highline.co.za giving the following details:

Airport transfer:

- Flight number, name of airline, date and time of arrival and where flight originated
- Group name
- Exact amount of people to be transferred
- Drop off address

Shuttle service:

- Exact date and time of pickup
- Exact address of pickup and drop off
- Amount of people requiring the service

Please note: The airport transfers and shuttle service are incorporated in the accommodation rate, so only bookings made through Highline Tours & Travel will have access to the shuttle service. There will be no other shuttle service provided.
